■ Entrance requirements

Students must hold a secondary school leaving certificate and have an A2 level of French to enrol.

Skills

During classes, students will be given opportunities to:

- Use oral and written communication skills in a variety of situations :
- Improve their knowledge and understanding of France and francophone cultures ;
- Develop cross-cultural skills;
- Acquire the language and academic skills they will need to study at a French university.

Course content

The program is made up of mandatory core modules and optional classes.

The mandatory core modules allow students to work on listening and speaking, reading and writing, grammar, and their knowledge of French culture and society.

The wide range of optional classes offer students a chance to practice their French while they learn about diverse subjects such as literature, art history, phonetics, business French, management, contemporary French history, theatre or French cinema.

Students are required to participate in a number of practical immersion projects such as interviews and surveys, visits to local businesses, discovery games and treasure hunts, face to face meetings with writers or cross-cultural workshops with students from local schools.

Continuous assessment is used to evaluate students.
