■ Presentation

The 'Intensive french language course' program combines General French classes and thematic workshops which will allow you to make rapid progress in the language and to increase your knowledge of the French culture and society.

■ Participants

All levels, from the age of 17.

For absolute beginners, there are 7 specific sessions a year in September, November, January, April, June, July and August.

■ Objectives

You will learn to communicate orally and in writing, and will quickly improve your level of French proficiency.

You will practice the language in a very active way in level groups specifically adapted to your needs.

You will discover the French culture and society through an immersive environment.



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■ Organization

Every week, 21 learning hours are organized as follows :

- 15 hours of practicing the verbal and written language (including language laboratory or multimedia laboratory)
- 6 hours of thematic workshop, for example :

Phonetic correction, verbal practicing through games, tutoring concerning the written communication, comic strip workshop, sociocultural workshop, language and theatre, language and songs, language and cinema, etc.

A placement test will be made at the beginning of the course, it will allow you to integrate a level group adapted to your needs.

A trainee certificate and an assessment sheet of your level of proficiency will be given to you at the end of the course.

And then depending on the exam schedule, you will be able to sit the DELF ('diplôme d'études de langue française') / DALF ('diplôme approfondi de langue française') diploma or a TCF ('test de connaissance du français') certification.
